## Rational and irrational manifestations in the culture of pre-scientific period

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*In the late twentieth century, the idea of scientific rationality is in question. This is due to the desire of the scientific thinking to change the scientific rationality and to complement it with the new interpretations, not excluding the element of irrationality. In contrast to the harmony of scientific rationality it is suggested that all forms of spiritual activity are based on rationality as they all have their own "logic" which is not always reducible to science. Therefore, to talk about the forms of rationality is inherent in myth, art, morality, religion. That alone leads to confusion of rational, irrational, and the need to analyze their relationship.*
