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The concept of being in modern philosophy

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The concept of being is traditionally used to refer to everything that exists. This definition in the cognitive paradigm of subject-object relations endows being with the status of an object and is a tautology. Phenomenology is aimed at the study of being as a state of primary indifferent integrity, in which the object is not opposed to the subject. This integrity, however, is studied through the analysis of quite specific manifestations of the individual's spiritual activity. An approach to the definition of the concept of being is proposed, which describes it as the most abstract concept, which is objective and coincides in content with the most abstract object.
