The joint strategy of the USSR, Great Britain and France against German aggression in the summer of 1939

The article considers the joint policy of the governments and diplomats of the USSR, France and Great Britain aimed at deterring German aggression on the eve of the Second World War. It is noted that representatives of the diplomatic corps of European countries during the Moscow Conference in 1939 advocated countering aggression. The USSR pursued a policy of cooperation between European countries, improving relations between Poland and the USSR, and creating a front against aggression.
