It is carried out the analysis of the discussion in the US Senate on the universal international security organization establishment. An analysis of the Senate records for 1943-1945, Hearings on the Charter of the United Nations before the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations, as well as memoirs allowed to the conclusion that the great role was played by Mackinac Declaration of the US Republican Party (1943) and Connolly resolution. At the time of the UN Charter to the Senate in 1945, most of the contentious issues have already been taken and this has allowed US senators without much discussion to ratify the UN Charter.
