The problem of NRM typologization on the example of demarcation between the New Age movement and the neopaganism

It is considered the problem of typologization of new religious movements, the blurring of the boundaries between the New Age movement and neo-paganism. A comparison is made of the ratio of these currents, their general, different, in Russia and foreign studies. The presence of all three possible relationships of inclusion between these concepts is demonstrated. Special attention is paid to the movement "Anastasia", one of the largest new religious in post-secular Russia. By applying typological criteria to the doctrine of this group, the problems of demarcation between the two directions of the NRM typology are demonstrated.
